The Forum has taken lead in West Berkshire on many new initiatives and programmes including celebrating Black History Month at West Berkshire Museum, and presenting the Anne Frank Exhibition at Newbury Central Library. Both these events were very well attended and we hope to offer something similar in the future.

The ME Forum is proud to be involved in establishing Empowering West Berkshire (EWB). It is setup to enable and empower community groups, charities and voluntary

bodies to achieve their objectives; assisting groups though support advice and guidance.

We now look forward to many more cultural events, but most importantly engaging with our stake holders while continuously making new friends.



Holocaust Memorial Events in West Berkshire

West Berkshire Minority Ethnic Forum hosted Holocaust Memorial Day 2011 in Newbury. This was a two part programme which began with the Anne Frank Exhibition at the Newbury Library in January 2011. This was the first event in the twentieth anniversary year of the Anne Frank Trust UK. Gillian Walnes, Executive Director of the Anne Frank Trust UK. opened the exhibition with a reminder of how and why this well known story is still so relevant to society today. Over 500 people, including students from several local schools, visited the exhibition. A team of trained Anne Frank guides, including two students from Newbury College were on hand to assist anyone.

The second part of this programme was on March 9th at Newbury Town Hall with an evening event to mark the "Untold Stories" theme for HMD 2011. Nadeem Soomro, Chair of West Berkshire Minority Ethnic Forum welcomed almost sixty guests to this event. Opening remarks were made by lan Grose, Mayor of Newbury, Lady

Stevenson, High Sherriff of the Royal County of Berkshire and Graham Pask, Chairman of West Berkshire Council.

The main speaker was Ruth Barnett who came to England aged four, on the Kindertransport in 1939 from Berlin. Overcoming a difficult start to life in a foreign country, Ruth became a successful psychotherapist and now speaks to groups of all ages. She recently wrote her autobiography entitled "A Woman of No Nationality".

She spoke of the current prejudice shown to Gypsy communities and warned how we must all work to prevent such prejudice and discrimination from taking hold.

On the theme of "Untold Stories" Mr Mike Fuhr spoke movingly about his father's escape from Austria by train; where he was befriended by a senior Nazi officer.

Allan Mercado from Newbury spoke about an old boy from his school, St Bartholomew's. He was a medical student, and was sent to help at Belsen Concentration Camp. Both events were project managed by Marcia Perkin; an Imperial War Museum Fellow in Holocaust Education. Black History Month

The event spanned over two weeks with an exhibition featuring artefacts from around the

World, presentations, and thoughtprovoking discussion evenings looking at issues of intolerance around the World in recent history. Cllr Julian Swift-Hook, Shadow Executive Member for Equalities, Adult Social Care and ICT for West Berkshire Council states "I thoroughly enjoyed the Black History Month programme put on by the Forum – it wasn't just about black history, there were some fascinating presentations about many minority groups and cultures and the difficulties that they face even today in our apparently open multicultural society". Cllr Swift-Hook also adds "I was particularly interested to learn more about the different traveller communities, their way of life, and the prejudices they face". We hope that the Forum is able to have a similar event to celebrate Black History Month in 2011.

DiwaliFesival of Light

The WBMEF, in partnership with the Corn Exchange and the West Berkshire Indian Society, presented a Diwali celebration to a full house; with dance and music performances and an Indian style disco. We were delighted to have the presence of so many dignitaries at the event, including Lady Stevenson, the High Sherriff of Berkshire. 
Ingagement & Updates
